





INTON is one of the !. velous cities in Indiana, if not in the entire west. In 1900 it had a population of 3,071. In 1906 according to the census and the new directory figures it has a population of over 12000. In these six years it has made the most remarkab inmercial and municipal strides of any city in the great state of Indiana. The principal reasons for this rapid development is due to opening of its immense bituminous coal fields, which were made possible by the construction of new railroads. Linton is located in the very heart of the greatest bituminous coal fields west of Pittsburg. The coal is ot only almost inexhaustible in quantity but it is of the highest quality of steam and domestic coal and is found in the very best mining conditions. Mine labor is the highest price labor in the state. Linton has the largest per capita pay roll in Indiana. It has the most money per capita in actual circulation in the state, and it is all new money brought in here every fifteen days to pay for coal. The money is dumped in by the thousands of dollars daily and we can see nothing gone that we have missed. This is one of the things which makes Linton the best business town in the state and which is bound to make it one of the greatest in the west. Its population is mostly enterprising, wide-awake, hustling Am rican born citizens. There is not a negro in the city nor is one permitted to remain here. There is not a Chinese in the city. In fact there are but few foreigners of any kind and those we have are mostly of the better class, such as the thrifty model Germans and the polite and polished French. The city has miles of brick and McAdam streets, fine cement sidewalks everywhere, the finest hydrant water to be found in Indiana in inexhaustible quantities, a splendid electric light plant, and a modern artificial gas plant, and is now putting in a complete sanitary sewer system that will touch every piece of property in the city. Interurban railroads are surveyed and will be constructed within the next year, reaching all the mines within a radius of fifteen miles of the city, making this the commercial centre for all this densely populated territory, and enabling the men to live in the city and enjoy its comforts and go to and from their work daily at a triffing cost. The completion of this system will add thousands to its present population and rapidly increase the value of property. Linton has a fine system of public schools and three large, new, fine school houses and strong churches and splendid edifices in nearly all the denominations. The city has three well equiped modern newspaper and job printing plants. Three weekly and one daily newspaper—The Daily Call—are printed. The latter is in its sixth year, is equiped with Mergenthaler machine, is the only daily in the Linton district and fills the place so completely that there is no demand nor an opening for another daily. The Record and Citizen, the latter, recently started, are both up-to-date and a credit to the city. All the leading secret and fraternal orders are strongly represented in the city. It is one of the greatest lodge towns in the state. The Elks have one of the finest club rooms in the state. There are four railroad systems entering the city—the Illinois Central, the Pennsylvania, the Chicago, Indianapolis & Louisville [Monon route] and the Southern Indiana. It is the only city in Indiana having four direct railroads to Chicago—three to Indianapolis, and on completion of the Souther. Indiana, now under construction, will have four to Indianapolis.

It is so situated that passengers or freight from Linton can reach ('hicago, St. Louis, Evansville, Louisville, Cincinnati or Indianapolis within a few hours. It is surrounded by one of the finest and richest agricultural, stock raising and fruit growing sections in the west, and possesses abundance of stone and timber and inexhaustible beds of undeveloped iron ore, which will soon be accessible by an extension of the Illinois Central railroad almost completed. All the surrounding country is covered with free gravel roads, enabling the country people to reach town at any time. Almost every farmer has free daily rural route mail service and most of them also have telephones in their homes. The city has a splendid city government, a high class of progressive business men and moral citizens. Its citizenship will compare favorably with any city of its size. It is as different from the western mining camps of rowdies and cowboys or the eastern coal mines with their negroes and dagoes as day is from night. It is truly a city of pretty homes, fine streets, numerous secret orders owning their own homes, model free schools, and all that goes to make life worth living. Fortune after fortune has been made here within the last few years and the city is only in its infancy. Great opportunities are now open in every branch of business. We have been so busy opening our mines and building our city that we have had but little time to devote to manufactories. The city certainly offers great opportunities for the location of all kinds of factories, because of its fine railroad advantages, cheap fuel right at the factory when it can always be had without delay in shipment, and cheap factory sites. All these things, with 150 square miles of coal unmined, with about 10,000 tons to the acre make it impossible to look into Linton's future. To hazard a guess at its population five years hence would be toying with figures. The glad hand of welcome is extended to all good citizens to come and be one of us. You will make no mistake to come to Linton. The Commercial club invites correspondence with all kinds of manufactories which seek new locations where they can have better railroad facilities, be nearer the great centers of distribution and where they can get cheap fuel and not be annoyed by the delays occasioned by shipment as in recent years by shortage of cars. All meritorious enterprises will be encouraged and such assistance rendered as lies within our power. Come to Linton.

Investments made in Linton will continue to increase in value as the city increases in wealth and population, and it is as sure to do this as day follows night. No mistake can be made by investing in real estate or in any kind of business in Linton. If you are going to change locations you had just as well come to a growing, progressive city, having all the comforts of life and where every body is prosperous. The place to make money is where money is. Come to Linton.
